This powerful and easy-to-use machine is available to all plot holders to help with soil preparation and maintenance.

To use the rotovator, you will need to arrange a brief introduction with one of the committee members, who will show you how to operate it safely and provide access to the machine.

Please clean the machine after use, transport the rotovator to your plot on its transport wheel, do not drive it and spoil the grass walkway. Happy Growing!

A FEW REMINDERS

>>> DOGS

Dogs will only be permitted on Allotment Garden sites if they are always kept under proper control. Proper control is defined as a dog being on a lead, muzzled if the dog requires it, and close enough to the person in charge that it can be restrained if necessary or respond immediately to voice commands.

Following investigation, sanctions for breaches to 'proper control' include a 3-month probationary period during which any further dog-related incidents may result in the dog being permanently excluded from the Allotment Garden site and/or the termination of the Allotment Garden Tenancy.

>>> STRUCTURES

All applications to erect sheds, greenhouses, fruit cages or any other structure must be applied for in writing to the secretary, with a drawing of the plot indicating the location of the structure.

All structures must conform with the Allotment Garden Tenancy Agreement.

>>> PERSONAL ITEMS

Please remove any personal items that may be left in the communal buildings. Any exceptions should be discussed and agreed with the Chairman and Site Manager.

>>> FRUIT TREES

Only fruit trees may be planted on Allotment Garden plots. They may only be of dwarf root stock and must only be planted near to the centre of the Allotment Garden. Fruit trees, plants and shrubs must not overshadow or overhang adjoining Allotment Garden plots.
